Due to a school closure and district downsizing, the Kiwanis Club of Glendora's Reading Partnership was forced to evolve. School Board member and Kiwanis Reading Partnership lead, Dr. Chuck Gomer, arranged for the program to move to Stanton School, another elementary school in the Glendora Unified School District. With the assistance of retired reading teacher, Mrs. Debbie Damron, the Kiwanis Reading Partnership refined its focus to working with students in first and second grade who face challenges with reading.

Dyslexia is one of the many challenges that can significantly limit a student's reading ability. It is estimated that nearly one in five Americans express some degree of dyslexia, which is not a visual disorder as much as a language processing/auditory disorder. Using the Barton Reading and Spelling System, a system designed for students with dyslexia, Kiwanis volunteers worked with approximately twenty first and second .

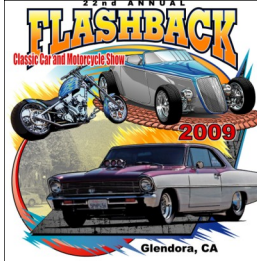

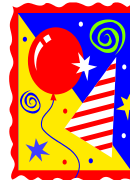

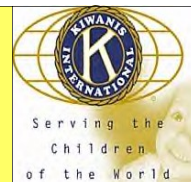
